Program completion Requirements

In order to be conferred a certificate of completion from the University of the Republic, the student must:

Be enrolled as an “Official” student;

Complete all 60 units of an offered program;
Master level students will complete 65 units (the remaining five units will come from a completed thesis).

Pay all financial costs associated with the program, as it is stated in the term the “Official” student status was granted.

“Official” students are on a certificate of completion tract that will terminate in a certificate of completion. “Official” students will be expected to pay full tuition obligations before being permitted to enroll in a course.

“Unofficial” students are not on a certificate of completion tract and their course completions do not terminate in a certificate of completion.

“Unofficial” students will be expected to pay full tuition obligations before being permitted to enroll in a course, but at a reduced cost.

The “Unofficial” student is permitted to convert to “Official” status at any time. However, only courses completed in the past five years will be considered.

To convert from “Unofficial” to “Official” student status, the “Unofficial” student will be required to pay the difference of what they have payed per course, as an “Unofficial” student and the current costs of tuition obligations at the time they wish to convert.

If the “Unofficial” student paid \$200.00 per course and has completed 10 – 4 unit courses, then they have paid \$2,000.00 into the program. If the current “Official” student tuition in the term they wish to convert is \$300.00 per course, then the student is liable for an additional \$1,500.00, before they are permitted to register and pay for their next course.

Please note – the mission of the University of the Republic is to provide a high-quality education at an affordable cost. The above stated tuition increase serves as an example only. The University of the Republic does not anticipate a need for such increases. The University of the Republic personnel have the greatest amount of confidence that tuition costs will remain inflation free, as much as possible.
